


# EARLY RELEASE ESTIMATES OF HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE


The National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) released health insurance coverage estimates for 2021 from the National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) as part of the NHIS Early Release Program. The estimates captured in this report are some of the first available coverage estimates for 2021 from a federal survey.

This infographic details national level changes in private coverage, public coverage, and those without health insurance coverage by age, sex, and race/ethnicity.


Note: All statistically significant year-over-year changes are significant at the 95% confidence level unless otherwise specified.









### Changes in Private Coverage Rates by Race/Ethnicity (Ages 0-64)






## Changes in Public Coverage Rates by Sex (Ages 0-64)




#### Changes in Public Coverage Rates by Race/Ethnicity (Ages 0-64)
