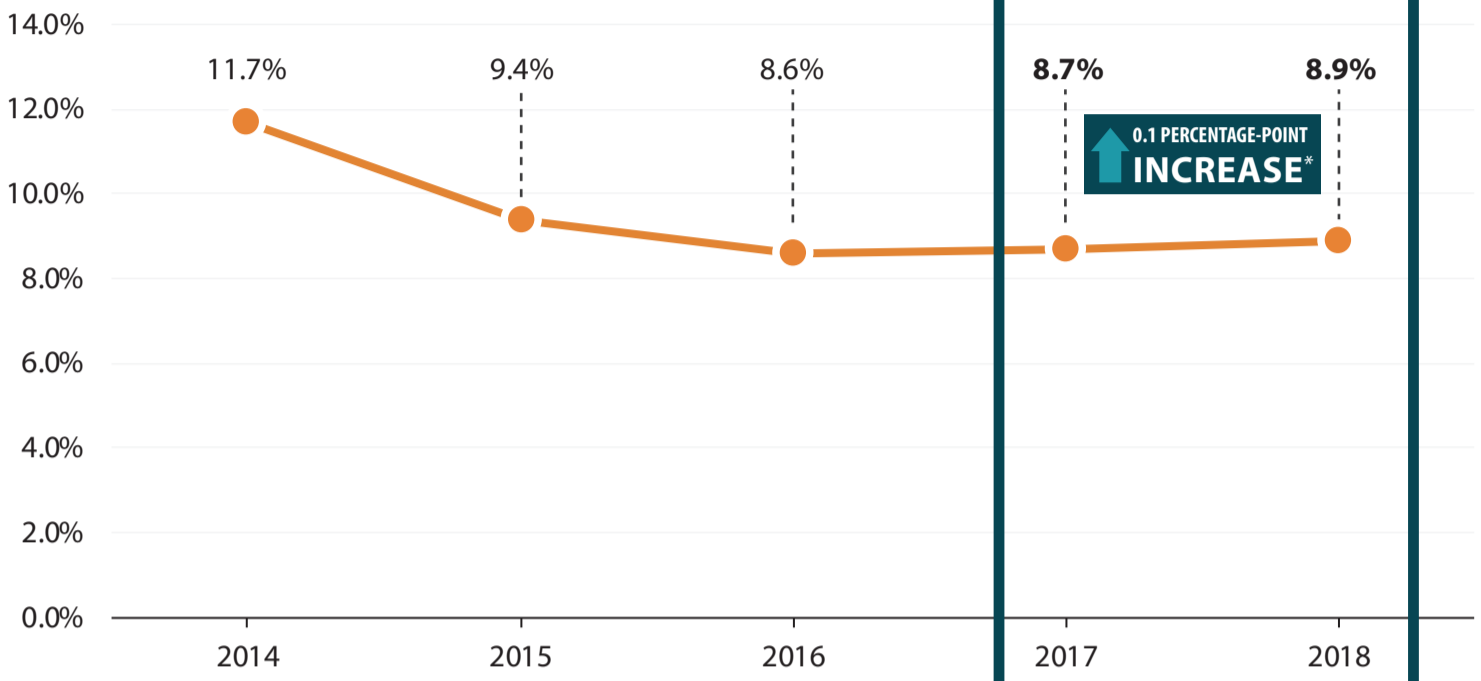


UNINSURED RATE INCREASED NATIONALLY AND IN EIGHT STATES IN 2018

ESTIMATES FROM THE AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY (ACS)

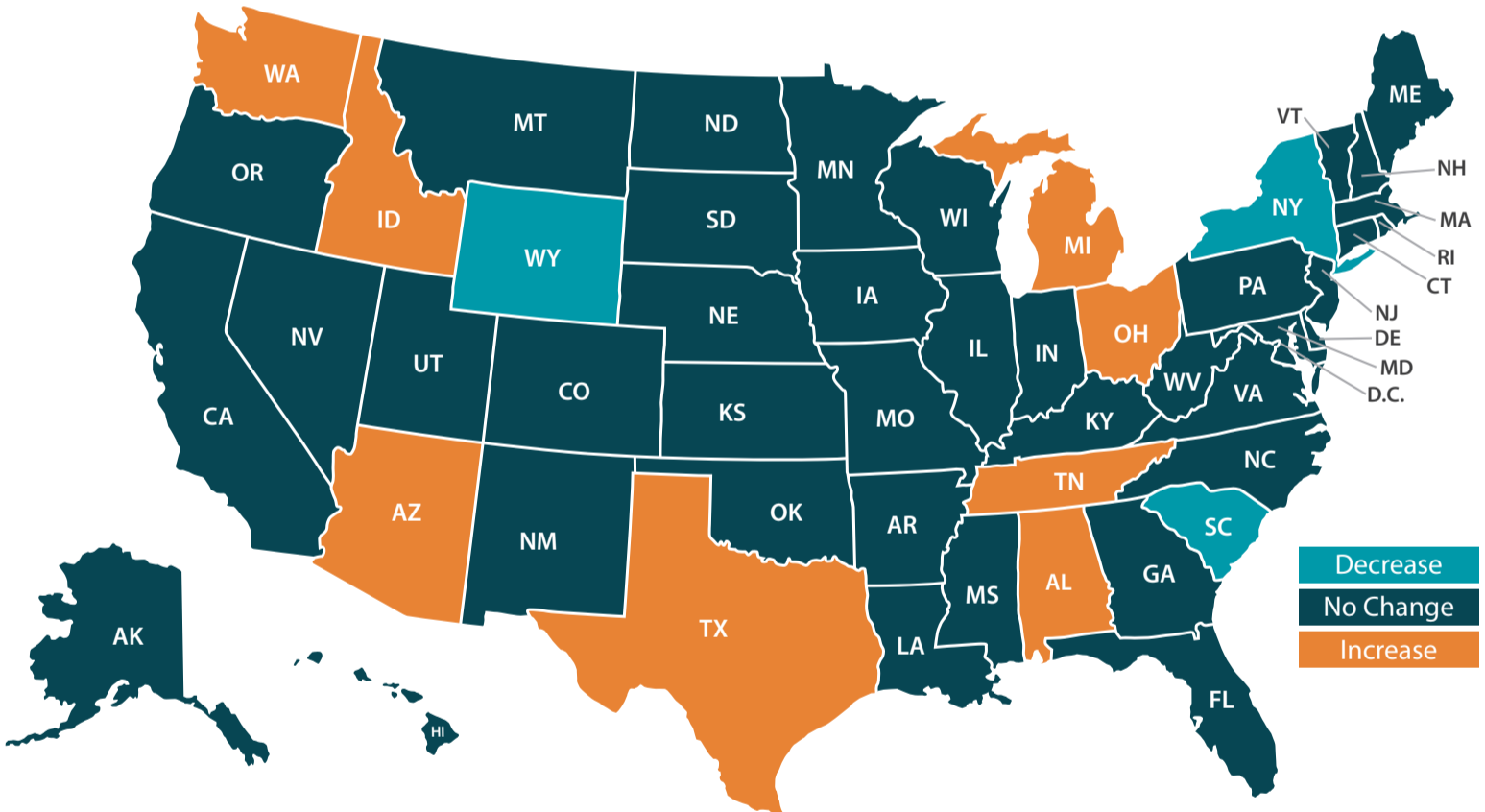
New data from the ACS show that the nation's uninsured rate increased significantly in 2018, rising from 8.7 percent in 2017 to 8.9 percent in 2018. Uninsurance also rose significantly in eight states in 2018, while falling significantly in three. Of these eleven states that saw significant changes in uninsured rates from 2017 to 2018, Idaho saw the largest increase from 10.1 percent to 11.1 percent, and Wyoming saw the largest decrease from 12.3 percent to 10.5 percent.

NATIONAL UNINSURED RATE OVER TIME, 2014-2018

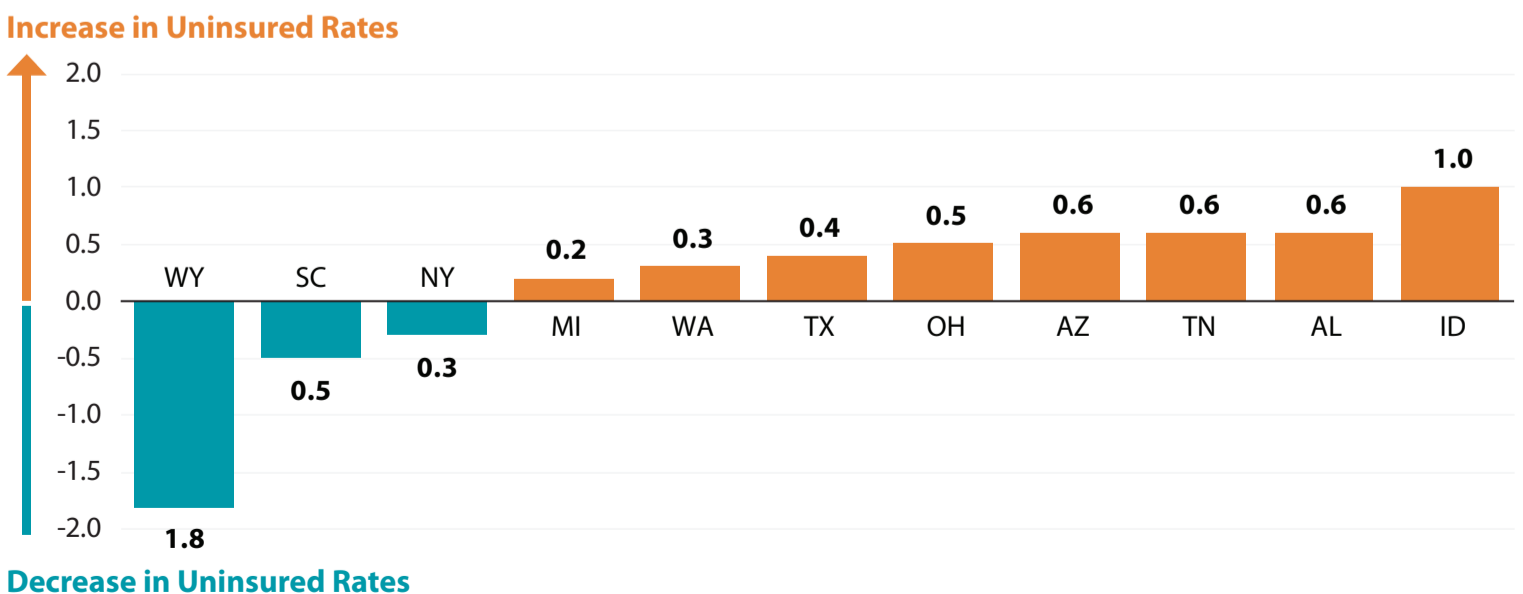


*Percentage-point change is calculated with unrounded numbers, which produces different results from using the rounded estimates in the graph above.
